COP 30 Belem, Brazil; 10th-21st November.

COPs, (The Conference of the Parties) is the annual meeting for all participants, countries and other interested parties, under the auspices of the United Nations. This year is very important.

10 years ago, an agreement was reached in Paris where all parties agreed to take action to limit global warming to less than 2C and aiming for 1.5C, by the end of the century. One of the major new ideas, which helped to get the agreement, in Paris, was that each country would produce its own 5-year plan, known as Nationally Determined Contributions in 2015, these indicated that warming would rise to over 3.4C). Also built into the Paris Agreement is the idea that every 5 years countries would submit new ambitions, hopefully improving previous targets and reducing fossil fuel emissions, thus improving the overall situation. *This 'Global Stocktake' will take place this year.*

In addition to this stocktake, discussions continue on finance for adaptation and mitigation. Sadly, this is linked with the Global Debt crisis, because most of the support for the poorest countries has ben given in loans, not grants, exacerbating the debt problems for the most vulnerable.
